What the CARES Act Means for Railway Workers

The **Coronavirus Aid**, **Relief and Economic Security** (CARES) Act provides significant support for rail workers and the industry in general.

Here are the most important provisions of the bill:

Grant Funding

Provides *\$1 billion* in grants to Amtrak

Worker Protections

- Requires the railroad to prioritize furloughs and avoid layoffs with these funds
- Ensures furloughed employees have the right to return to their jobs once intercity service is restored to March 1, 2020 levels – no later than the date on which the service has been fully restored
- Calls for Amtrak to report furloughs to Congress on a weekly basis
- Prevents Amtrak from permanently discontinuing any routes or customer services

Expanded Unemployment Insurance Benefits

- Brings railroad workers' unemployment insurance benefits on par with statebased unemployment insurance programs
 - Provides an additional \$600 per week for up to four months for railroad workers who are unemployed due to the pandemic
 - Allows for an additional 13 weeks of unemployment benefits through December 31, 2020
 - Temporarily eliminates the 7-day waiting period to start collecting unemployment benefits
